## **Sport Premium Funding to Primary Schools**

Sports Premium Funding is money that the Government gives to Primary Schools to improve physical education (PE) and sport. This funding can only be used by schools to improve their provision of PE and sport. The actual amount of funding that primary schools receive from the Government in 2018/19 is £16,000 plus £10 per primary-aged child (aged 5-11) as recoded in the annual schools census.

The Department for Education Vision for the Primary PE and Sport Premium Funding is that **all** *pupils* leaving primary school should be **physically literate** and with the **knowledge**, **skills and motivation** necessary to equip them for a **healthy**, **active lifestyle** and **lifelong participation** in physical activity and sport.
