This is just a reminder that earrings are not allowed in school. Thank you for your continued support with this. Children are also to wear black shoes in school and not trainers as part of our school uniform code.

## **World Book Day**

On <u>Friday 4th March 2022</u> all children and staff at St. Paul's will be celebrating <u>World Book Day</u>. We are encouraging the children to dress up as their favourite book character. You can choose any character you want! It would also be lovely if your child could bring in the book that their outfit is from.

The most imaginative and authentic ideas for costumes will be rewarded with prizes, however the main focus of the day is to celebrate a love for books and the characters created within them, so please encourage your child to join in. During the day, photographs will be taken for the school website. Prizes will then be given for the best dressed in each class.

We will also be launching our 'Extreme Reading' and 'Character Craft' competition during the week leading up to World Book Day (information to follow). On the day each child will receive a World Book Day £1 token to spend at any participating bookshop and you can either swap it for one of the eight specially produced W.B.D books. Alternatively, you may choose to use the voucher towards the price of any book worth £2.99 or more.

### **Attendance**

We ask for your support in all attendance matters. If your child is absent from school, please ensure that you contact school by no later than 9.30am on the day of absence by phone or email with the reason for absence. Emails should be sent to: <a href="mailto:admin@cdatstpaulsprimary.co.uk">admin@cdatstpaulsprimary.co.uk</a>. You can also now report absence through the school spider app. There are times when we will need to ask you additional questions or ask for additional information. This is part of the process that we have to follow in school. We thank you in advance for your support with this. We ask that if at all possible that appointments are made outside of school time. When this is not possible, please bring your child's appointment card or letter to the office.

## **Holidays in Term Time**

Government legislation states that only under exceptional circumstances may the Head teacher consider giving permission for a child to be absent from school at any point in the academic year. Under the legislation parents have no entitlement to take their child out of school for a holiday in term-time. This can lead to Penalty Notices

### Penalty Notices for Non-school attendance

Section 444(A) of the Education Act 1996 empowers the local authority to issue Penalty Notices in cases of unauthorised absence from school. This means that when a pupil has unauthorised absences of 10 sessions (5 days) or more, in a 12-week period (where no acceptable reason has been given for the absence) or if their child persistently arrives late for school after the close of registration, their parents may receive a Penalty Notice of £120, which is reduced to £60 if paid within 21 days. The Penalty Notice will need to be paid in full before 28 days of the notice being served. Failure to pay a penalty notice may result in prosecution (a separate penalty notice will be issued to each parent for each child).
