Remember 3 simple steps to keeping safe online

ZIP IT Keep your personal stuff private and think about what you say and do online

BLOCK IT Block people who send nasty messages and don't open unknown links and

attachments

FLAG IT Flag up with someone you trust if anything upsets you or if someone asks to meet you offline










- "keep your personal stuff private and think about what you say and do online"
- "keep your password and username to yourself"
- "don't tell anyone on the computer any personal details" - such as mobile number, school name, date of birth, home address etc
- "people can bully you online as well so be careful" - don't send or share nasty emails or pictures about others
- "treat people the way you would like to be treated"
- "don't lie about your age" most Social Network Sites have an age minimum of 13
- If you are old enough make sure your account is set as 'private' this way only your friends can see your photos etc
- "always ask a grown up before downloading something"








- "Block people who send you nasty messages and don't open unknown links and attachments"
- "don't pass on chain emails and never believe what they say"
- "Don't accept emails from people you don't know"
 - "block the person who sent it so they can never send anything to you again" - report the number or email address to the service provider / online moderator
 - Save a copy of any nasty text etc as evidence



Flag it...



- "Flag up with someone you trust if anything upsets you or if someone asks to meet you offline"
- "if you don't like what's going on-tell someone" - like a parent or an adult you trust such as a teacher or sports coach
- If you have arranged to meet somebody who you have only every talked to online always take an adult with you—they could have lied about who they really are
 - If you can't talk to somebody face to face use the online
