



### **St Paul's Behaviour Expectations (this is in addition to current behaviour policy of the school)**

The school's behaviour Policy is still in place. This document is an addendum to the policy to take account of changes in relation to the impact of Covid 19. Certain practical elements of the policy will operate differently. E.g. the children will not physically be given smilies/certificates at this time. Positive behaviours will, as always be celebrated by staff and positive praise given. We recognise that this is and has been a challenging time for the children and we will be focussing on their well-being. Support of the core behaviour policy and this addendum will be a key part of supporting theirs and staff well-being. It will also hopefully support your well-being as parents.

- We will be responsible, respectful and follow the instructions given by all adults, to keep us all safe and well.
- We arrive and leave school following the instructions of our teacher.
- We wash our hands for 20 seconds and use hand sanitiser when we arrive at our classroom and when directed by our teacher throughout the day.
- We stay within our group whilst we are at school and do not mix with other groups.
- We move around school safely using our line up code and keep one behind the other using the markings on the floor to guide us.
- In the classroom we have our own table where we work from. We stay in this place and keep it tidy. We have our own equipment and do not share it with others.
- We use tissues to catch our sneezes and coughs, bin the tissue and wash our hands. If we have no tissue, we sneeze and cough into our elbow.
- We try not to touch our faces and put our fingers in our mouths throughout the day.
- We tell our teacher if we are not feeling well.
- We have our own drinks bottle at our table, and we do not share any food with others.
- When playing outside we stay with our groups and play where our teacher can see us. We do not play in the trees or bushes and on the climbing frame.
- When we go to the toilet, we flush the toilet and wash our hands before returning to the classroom.
- We keep everyone of our friends and adults safe by not spitting and coughing at them.
- We are kind to others and do not say or do mean things towards others in any way, including comments or actions that relate to the virus. Such actions could be deemed as bullying.
- **Rewards:** We will still give smilies verbally in class, these will be marked on the board at the end of day and a record kept by the teacher. Bronze, Silver, Gold and Platinum rewards will be acknowledged through the home learning email system. Star of the day, which is usually celebrated by a paper certificate will also be acknowledged through the home learning emailing systems.
- **Sanctions:** In regards to smaller breaches of the policy, the child would be given warnings as follows: 1) Verbal warning 2) Name on board 3) Cross next to name. 4) second cross next to name. If the child receives two crosses it would mean they have had had 4 opportunities to modify their behaviour. If a child receives two crosses because of their behaviour choices the child will be asked to leave the classroom under the supervision of a member of staff for time out. They will be expected to

respect social distancing from others during this time and remain calmly in a designated space away from other groups. They will return to class when they are calm to do so and are ready to learn.

Children will be given warnings prior to this happening and given opportunities to change their behaviour, unless it is a more serious breach of the policy and addendum, that would put others at risk, in which case a senior leader would be called and the pupil involved would exit the room with them. They will be expected to respect social distancing from others during this time and remain calmly in a designated space away from other groups.

We understand that the children will take time to get use to new ways of being in school and they will be supported in adapting to these in a sensitive way.

If the children cannot persistently follow the behaviour policy of the school and its addendum you will be contacted. We ask that you talk through with your children, the key aspects of this document and support us fully in its implementation.

If there are serious breaches of the behaviour policy and its addendum, that put others at risk, then you may be called to school to collect your child. Re-entry to school on subsequent days would be subject to a review with the headteacher.

This Addendum takes effect from June 2020
